<u>Internship Program Recap:</u> Summer 2024 we were excited to welcome 98 interns. We are currently in the final week of programming.

- Applications received: 3,000 applications
 - o 200 apps from comm college
 - o 300 from hbcu
 - o 100 from ivy league
 - 12 from international schools
- Class profile of interns from
- NCSU 600 applications; most applicants
 - o Demographics
 - Longstanding partnerships
 - Diverse degree programs
- UNC-CH was runner up
- HBCU's highest NCA&T and NC Central
 - o Understand there is another HBCU program in state government offering internships to students.
 - HBCU and MIHE; 40 hr 10 weeks; \$17/hr
- Class Profile 2024:

- o 98 interns; 15 agencies
- o Female>male
- Lots of diff classes represented
- All diff types of schools represented
- Interns represented 30 counties in NC
- Inability to find housing possibly responsible for low attendance from western and northeast sides of NC

 - Confident there is enough time to enter proposals

New Business- Jean McBride

- Additional feedback for program:
 - Some law school students coming from institutions need to accept internship before fall semester ends in December
 - Unable to apply for state internship program
 - Reach out to career centers at law schools might have flexibility if through career center; if component of internship course would need that secure internship by certain time
- Feedback from board members:
 - o Council members required to review roughly 100 applications each
 - Council members tend to approve more than deny applications
 - See if meets minimal qualifications, major grammatical errors
 - Realize they are not the supervisor; wants agency to make final decision
 - o How many rejected during internship council review process?
 - 1,600 students forwarded to supervisors for interview process
 - o If council is subject matter expert look at those specific applications
 - Lots of council members support this
 - Align project proposals subject matter with council members expertise
 - Probably couldn't align perfectly
- Council leverage power to see if universities would be willing to host interns? Especially for those out west;

 Jean will look into what's being done in cross programs; see if HBCU is doing that; see if any other agencies have connections to provide housing
