The State of NC owns: 4347 buildings > 3000 square feet 99 counties 113,464,000 square feet

September 1, 2013 Current round of FCAP began as of March 24, 2015 78 counties complete 2003 buildings - inspected 41 million square feet 5,162 deficiencies documented **\$2.55** billion dollars Documented with estimates and digital photographs

of the **5162** documented deficiencies: **3043** are Priority: Immediate 691 are Priority: Within 1 year 665 are Priority: 1 to 2 years 763 are Priority: 3 to 6 years

of the **\$2.55** billion dollars in deficiencies: **\$1.37 billion is Priority:** if not sooner **\$281 million is Priority:** within 1 year **\$265 million is Priority:** 1 to 2 years **\$627 million is Priority:** 3 to 6 years
